

INFLATION NOTE

In one of the newspapers some time ago, we noted a small AP release reporting that in Evanston, Illinois, a chemist from Northwestern University had calculated that the total value of all chemicals in the average human body amounted to \$3.50.

The same chemicals (oxygen, carbon, hydrogen, nitrogen, calcium, phosphorous and other trace elements, including gold and silver) were only worth 98 cents during the depression year, 1936. This represents a cost increase of 257 percent. Inflation is everywhere.
